## PART ONE USEFUL EXPRESSIONS

1. Can I get to the Olympic Stadium from here by bus?
2. How long is the trip on the subway?
3. Does this bus stop close to the assembly point for Snow Hill?
4. Excuse me, but where can I find the nearest subway station?
5. How far is it to the hospital emergency room?
6. Should I turn left or right at the intersection?
7. Which direction is the bus to the station?
8. Cross the street after you pass the school and it will be on your left.
9. Go back straight down this street for about three blocks and turn right at the big shopping mall.
10. Go that way for tfive blocks until you get to the fire station. Ask someone there.
11. It's right on the other side of the city centre.
12. Keep going until you reach the gas station. They can direct you further.
13. Just follow me, I'm going that way.
14. Take the second on the left and go straight on past the big church.
15. I am heading in the direction where you can take the bus you need. Follow me.
